

- Remove outer gloves
- Perform hand hygiene
- Don new, clean, outer gloves
- Wipe down any equipment that can be reused using Oxivir wipes
- After cleaning any equipment that needs to be cleaned, use a wipe in your hand to push cleaned equipment into “warm” zone
- In patient room, remove gown and outer gloves
 - a. Grab near shoulders of gown and pull firmly down and away from body, breaking the neckline of the gown.
 - b. Break tie around waist while rolling the gown inside out, working away from your body and down your arms, towards your hands.
 - c. Once you reach your wrist, use the clean, inside portion of the gown to help remove the gloves from your hands. Keep the gloves inside the balled up gown.
 - d. Dispose of gown and gloves in trash, unless visibly contaminated by blood or body fluids. Then treat as regulated medical waste (red bag).
- Open door
- Exit patient room
- Close door
- Doff inner gloves
- Hand hygiene
- Don clean gloves
- Remove OR cap. Grasp OR cap from the top of the head and pull back and away from your face.
- Hand hygiene
- Remove face shield by grabbing from the sides, not the front. Place on designated disinfection table.
- Perform hand hygiene
- Remove N95 by grabbing the straps and pulling forward. Remove the bottom band first. Do NOT touch the front of the mask.

**** If reusing N95, place directly in NEW paper bag, blue side towards the sky.*
- Remove gloves
- Perform hand hygiene

CLEANING EYE PROTECTION

- Don clean pair of gloves
- Clean face shield with bleach wipes and place in the “clean” bucket. The surface should remain wet for at least three minutes. Allow equipment to air dry; do not wipe surfaces dry. Once the surface is dry, if cloudy, you can use a damp towel to clear the residue.
